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NEXT STOP outstanding!

That's the target of Cambridge Street School in Batley after their latest Ofsted inspection.

The independent Muslim boys high school now meets all of the standards expected after being required to draw up an action plan when a previous inspection found shortcomings in the effectiveness of its teaching.

But a programme of staff training and investment in resources has seen an improvement at the school, with the headteacher and other leaders at the school also praised for monitoring the quality of lesson planning and teaching.

The report says action taken by the school has led to a sharp focus on the quality of learning.

It says staff plan lessons that build on previous learning and enable pupils to make good progress.

Almost all pupils make good progress across a wide range of subjects, and especially in English, mathematics and science.

The report also says that pupils value the additional lessons they receive to improve their learning if they are struggling to make all the progress that is expected of them.

External examinations in summer 2017 showed that at the end of key stage 4, a high proportion of pupils at the school achieved well across range of subjects at GCSE level.

This was the second progress monitoring inspection following the school's first standard inspection in September 2016.

It was conducted on notice.

The purpose of the inspection was to monitor progress the school is making in meeting the school standards requirements. The school was judged to not meet its previous grade.
